Susan Dorothea White

A painter, sculptor, printmaker and author, with a career spanning 6 decades, Susan studied at SA School of Art and Julian Ashton Art School; first solo exhibition in 1962; participated in international exhibitions/biennales since 1980; and held solo exhibitions in New York, Amsterdam, Cologne, Munich, Sydney, Adelaide.

Head in the Clouds

Inspired by William Blake's poem 'The Little Black Boy', Head in the Clouds is the face of the mother who says '...and this sunburnt face is but a cloud, and like a shady grove.'

In the Grip of Caffeine

Inspired by the barista's rosetta in a coffee cup. Here, the rosetta pattern is transformed into a 3D carving, mimicking the texture of milky foam; the swirls morph into hands that grip a face with a look of anticipation at the thought of enjoying a cup of coffee.

Centenarian Sunset, Mum at 102

My mother, 102 years old, inspired this carving. Although she was blind, I wanted to show the alert expression in her eyes. She enjoyed crosswords and whenever "the elderly" were mentioned, she asked "who are they?" The marble is from the Barossa Valley where her ancestors settled.
