



# **SPRING FESTIVAL OF DRAWING, 1981**

This is the fifth biennial MPAC Festival of Drawing and already the entry of more than 300 works guarantees the collections a further notable advance towards developing a major regional representation of Australian drawing. Drawings in the collections up to 30 June 1981 number 215 and include groups of works by many of the country's leading artists, most of whom have been most generous in supporting the Festival and its ideals.

It is interesting to note the changes in attitude towards the art of drawing since 1973, not only in Australia but throughout the world. From having been held in scant regard by advocates of international abstraction eight years ago it passed from this period of neglect to become virtually an alternative aesthetic life style', before its final restoration as basic

generator of the creative impulse in art.

For the impulse that began on the cave walls of Altamira and Lascaux more than fifteen thousand years ago has been followed by children, by primitives, and by masters ever since. Within the tiny germ of that generative urge lies the magic of art, the indefinable something which like life itself, can never be explained or replaced. In our remarkable times scientists shaping the new, computerised age have had recourse to the use of the silicon chip, and in discovering this fundamental source of energy control they have focussed attention on primeval origins. By such oblique means and for such reasons, drawing has been restored to its own. But above and beyond these reflections it lives because it is metaphor and understood by all great artists as such. As A.T. Quiller-Couch once wrote in a letter, of C.S. Lewis' *Dymer*, 'He has the gift of metaphore too, which Aristotle was cunning enough to spot as the one quality of style which cannot be taught or imparted because it is genius, and its happy owner is born with it'.
